Flipped: The Upside Down Kingdom (Let God be the Judge)

Jesus doesn't teach Christian community will be perfect. How should believers respond when a fellow sinner sins?

#1 Christ-followers should not be HYPERCRITICAL:

Matthew 7:1-2, 1 "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. 2 For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.

- Jesus is not saying: turn blind eye to sin; refuse to discern true & false or good & evil.
- Yes, we use discernment, but we're not a judge in the sense of being overly critical & condemning. We shouldn't judge harshly. The hypercritical is a fault-finder that's negative and hurtful to others and actually enjoys discovering failure, with no grace given to their motives.
- Here are four reasons from Scripture on why we should not be judgmental:
 - 1. This type of judging increases God's judgement on us: Matthew 7:1-2
 - 2. We're not the judge, we're among the judged: <u>James 4:12</u>, ... There is only one Lawgiver and Judge, the one who is able to save and destroy. But you—who are you to judge your neighbor?
 - 3. These are God's servants & children we're judging: Romans 14:4, Who are you to judge someone else's servant? To their own master, servants stand or fall. & they will stand, for the Lord is able to make them stand.
 - 4. We can't accurately read hearts & motives: <u>1 Corinthians 4:5</u>, ...judge nothing before the appointed time; wait until the Lord comes. He will bring to light what is hidden in darkness & will expose the motives of the heart.

#2 Christ-followers should not be HYPOCRITICAL:

Matthew 7:3-5a, 3 "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? 4 How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? 5 You hypocrite...

- · Self-righteousness is being most bothered by another's sin.
- We have personal sins to deal with, and it's hypocritical to worry about other people's sins more than our own.
- That's what's condemned, a lack of self-awareness. A desire to correct others but not correct ourselves.
- Good advice: Open your ears to hear & your heart to love, long before you open your mouth to correct.

#3 Christ-followers should be QUICKER TO ENCOURAGE than to criticize:

Matthew 7:5b, ...first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

- Jesus doesn't remove our responsibility toward one another.
- · What a motivation do we have to first deal with our own sin?
 - 1. Credibility (first take the plank out of your own eye)
 - 2. Spiritual health personally (you will see clearly)
 - 3. The <u>privilege of helping</u> another find victory (*to remove*)
 - 4. Compassion desires to reduce pain in others (the speck)
 - 5. We should <u>love</u> who Christ loves (*from your brother's eye*)

#4 Christ-followers should use JUDGMENT IN EVANGELISM:

Matthew 7:6, 6 "Do not give dogs what is sacred; do not throw your pearls to pigs. If you do, they may trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you to pieces.

- Jesus teaches there are some who act like animals and completely miss the value of the gospel, or will be mad.
- Believers are to be slow to judge, but also wisely discern people's response and instead of continuing to share the gospel to those who adamantly reject it, they should (1) <u>pause</u>, (2) <u>pray</u>, and (3) <u>re-engage</u> if a door opens.

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
